4. New Challenge Grant Projects Reviewed

- a. TP 22-4-66, 22-4-3. This farm is located on Todd Rd and consists of approximately 93 acres. This is a dairy farm which includes 50 dairy cows and 50 heifers. There is pasture and fields that grow alfalfa and corn
- b. TP 22-7-62, 22-7-50.1. This farm is approximately 88.4 acres and is on Long Lane (off of Pleasant View Rd) and is a 3 crop rotation cycle (Corn Alfalfa and wheat). There is also hay cut and some vegetables. There is an old railway line owned by Chester County running between the parcels so there will need to be a right of way given by the County.

5. 1st Headwaters Application Reviewed

TP 22-4-4.1 This is a 70 acre farm on Welsh Rd with fields in corn alfalfa and hay. There is dairy and poultry grown also. This is the 1st application to go through the Headwaters Program. Chester County, the Open Space Institute, The City of Wilmington in Delaware and The Brandywine Conservancy has committed 60% of the development value. This leaves 40% to be reviewed by the Township for funding. This is 10% less than the traditional challenge grant commitment.

After reviewing the financials to assure that the funding was available, Dave Rotelle made a motion to approve all the farms (4a, 4b, 5), seconded by Susan Lacy all approved

6. Signage Update

All agreed to continue looking into providing signs that would be available for preserved farms. John R was going to ask around to see what the Amish community felt about it. To be revisited next meeting
