

HONEY BROOK TOWNSHIP
Ordinance No. 10

An Ordinance regulating the keeping or dumping of garbage and other refuse, prescribing remedies for the abatement of nuisances and prescribing penalties for violations.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors, Honey Brook Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same and pursuant to the authority granted by the Act of the Legislature approved May 1, 1933, P. L. 103 amended, as follows:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known and be cited as "Honey Brook Township Refuse Control Ordinance."

Section 2. REGULATIONS. It shall be unlawful for any person, partnership, association, firm or corporation to keep or suffer to remain on his, her, or its premises, or on any private property, any excess, garbage, offal, putrid meat, noxious liquors, food containers, or other offensive or unwholesome matter, or cast the same upon any vacant lot, or upon any lot, or piece of ground belonging to this Township, or in any highway, street or alley, or upon the shores or margins of any of the streams within this Township, or so near the limits thereof as to annoy and be offensive. Any violation of this Section shall be declared to be a public nuisance.

Section 3. VIOLATIONS. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, by summary proceeding, be sentenced to pay not more than twenty (\$20.00) Dollars and the costs of prosecution, provided that each day's violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.
