ORDINANCE NO. 40

**AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING PARKING, STOPPING
AND STANDING OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON SPECIFIED ROADS
IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HONEY BROOK**

WHEREAS, Honey Brook Township has the right and responsibility to regulate and/or restrict parking, stopping and standing on roads within the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of Honey Brook Township have engaged the services of an engineer who has performed a study and investigation regarding same in accordance with 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6105 and 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6109(e); and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of Honey Brook Township have determined, in accordance with the prescribed traffic and engineering investigations that it would be in the best interests of the Township to establish certain restricted parking areas:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Honey Brook Township do ordain and enact the following:

Section (1): Based on the investigation and other accepted traffic engineering principles, the south side of the reach of U.S. Traffic Route 322, also known as Horseshoe Pike, located east of Birdell Road and west of Cupola Road shall be restricted against parking.

Section (2): The said reach is approximately 400 feet long and shall be posted with appropriate signage, including "No Stopping or Standing" signs as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

Section (3): From and after the effective date hereof, no person shall park, stop, or stand a motor vehicle on the south side of U.S. Traffic Route 322 between Birdell Road and Cupola Road.


Section (4): Anyone violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to proceedings and penalties as set forth in the Vehicle Code.

Section (5): If any section, provision, or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional, such unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, provisions or parts of this Ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have enacted and ordained the remaining sections, provisions, or parts of this Ordinance if it had known that such sections, provisions, or parts there would be declared unconstitutional.

Section (6): The Ordinance shall be effective five (5) days after its enactment.
