A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE  
PENSION PLAN AND TRUST FOR THE NON-UNIFORMED  
EMPLOYEES OF HONEY BROOK TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS Honey Brook Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, has established a Pension Plan for the non-uniformed employees of the Township; and

WHEREAS the Plan in Section 11.01 provides that the Plan may be amended at any time; and

WHEREAS the applicable statute provides that the amendment of such Pension Plan may be by Ordinance or Resolution;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Supervisors of Honey Brook Township hereby amends this Pension Plan and Trust, such amendments to read as follows:

1) Definition 1.08 "Employee" is amended by adding this sentence: "EXCEPTION:  
Uniformed and Non-Uniformed members of the Township's police force shall be  
eligible for the police Pension Plan and shall not be eligible to participate in this Plan  
while serving as an active police officer.

2) ARTICLE II, ELIGIBILITY is amended by adding this new section 2.04 to read as  
follows:

"2.04 An Employee who has terminated his service as a Township police officer shall  
be eligible to participate in this Plan on the first day of the month after he has left the  
police force provided that he has completed the required one year of Township service  
and has attained age 21."

3) ARTICLE III, contributions, is amended by adding this sentence at the end of the first  
paragraph:

"If a Member is terminated from this Plan as of December 31 of any Plan year, the  
Township shall contribute on behalf of such Member an amount equal to ten percent  
(10%) of his Compensation for all days served after the end of the last Pay Period in  
December through December 31<sup>st</sup> of that year.

4) ARTICLE VII, TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT, is amended by adding this new section 7.04 to read as follows:


“7.04 CHANGE OF STATUS: A Member who is terminated from this Plan and becomes a Member of the Police Pension Plan on or after January 1, 1999, shall not be treated as a termination of employment. He shall not forfeit any rights which he had in his Member Account as described above.”

All of the above amendments shall be effective as of January 1, 1999.

Adopted as a Resolution of Honey Brook Township this 9<sup>th</sup> day of December,  
1998.


