100 Acres Preserved



A conservation easement was recently completed on a privately-owned farm that will permanently protect 100 acres of prime farmland in Honey Brook Township. Master Plan Approved

On June 3rd, the Chadds Ford Township Board of Supervisors voted to approve the Chadds Ford Village Master Plan (Simone Collins and McMahon Associates, May 2015) and pledged to begin making the vision a reality. The Master Plan provides a range of recommendations to transform Chadds Ford Village into a safer, walkable destination. Chadds Ford Village was identified in the Strategic Action Plan (SAP) as a cultural Hub in the southern region of the Brandywine Creek Greenway, and the Master Plan implements three projects outlined in the SAP (pp. 59-61):
